Intravenous therapy or IV therapy is the giving of liquid substances directly into a vein. It can be intermittent or continuous; continuous administration is called an intravenous drip. The word intravenous simply means "within a vein", but is most commonly used to refer to IV therapy.

### Intravenous (IV) Therapy Technique - Nurseslabs

In acute care, they enable rapid and reliable intravenous administration of drugs and fluids and are used to monitor central venous pressure. In other areas, such as cancer care, they may be used for patients undergoing long-term, continuous or repeated intravenous treatments, such as chemotherapy, and for blood sampling.

### About Intravenous Medication Administration

8.2 Intravenous Fluid Therapy Intravenous therapy is treatment that infuses intravenous solutions, medications, blood, or blood products directly into a vein (Perry, Potter, & Ostendorf, 2014). Intravenous therapy is an effective and fast-acting way to administer fluid or medication treatment in an emergency situation, and for patients who are unable to take medications orally.

Of the utmost importance is that the administration setup ensures chemotherapy is given safely and allows for prompt nursing intervention in the event of an adverse reaction or ...

### Special Considerations When Administering IV Chemotherapy ...

All intravenous lines, including central lines, PICC lines, and venous access devices are invasive lines that can lead to catheter associated health care related infections unless they are cared for in the proper manner. As with all aspects of intravenous therapy, only the nurse is permitted to monitor, maintain and care for these lines and sites.

Intravenous Fluid Therapy. Intravenous fluid therapy is needed when ORT fails or is contraindicated. The usual approach is to administer 20 mL/kg aliquots of isotonic fluid (e.g., normal saline) over 20 to 60 minutes, with frequent reexamination to determine the need for additional bolus administration.

### Intravenous Drug Administration - an overview ...

A patient with a history of cancer is prescribed an intravenous (IV) infusion of chemotherapeutic agents through a peripherally inserted central catheter (PICC). The primary health care provider instructs the nurse to flush the catheter before and after medication administration.

Most times, home health care nurses are available 24 hours a day. If there is a problem with the IV, you can call your home health care agency for help. If the IV comes out of the vein: First, put pressure over the opening where the IV was until the bleeding stops. Then call the home health care agency or the doctor right away.
