How To Ace Your Answer To "What Is Your Greatest Weakness?"

When asked to present a weakness, find a way to emphasize the upside. For instance, you might say that you're working to improve a particular weakness or explain how a weakness might be considered a strength (if you are a bit too detail-oriented, you can explain how this actually helps you produce quality work).

How to Answer "What Are Your Strengths and Weaknesses?"

As always, one of the interview questions they'll be asked is about their strengths and weaknesses. First up is Francine. When she's asked, "What are your greatest strengths and weaknesses?" Francine responds, "My strength is that I'm a hard worker. My weakness is that I get stressed when I miss a deadline because someone else dropped the ball."

When addressing your weaknesses, draw upon examples relating to either skills/habits or personality traits. You may want to choose which to focus on depending on the type of job for which you're interviewing. For example, discussing a skill or habit may be highly relevant for a technical position.

Choosing Your Weakness: Hard Skills vs. Soft Skills Typically, weaknesses fall into one of two categories -- "hard skills" or "soft skills" -- and hard skills are usually the best to choose for a job interview because they are the easiest to overcome.

Job Interview Question: What's Your Greatest Weakness ...

Pick Minor weaknesses So how to answer the interview question 'What are your weaknesses?? Pick a minor weakness (but not too minor, see examples hereafter): Select a neutral weakness carefully – Something that is not critical to the job. Then, tell [the interviewer] what you are doing to overcome it.

So what's the best way to handle the weakness question and answer portion of an interview? The truth is that there is no one response, however there are thoughtful ways to discuss both strengths and weaknesses that are different from the typical generic answers many employers view as a cop-out.
