ISO/IEC 17025 is the global quality standard for testing and calibration laboratories. It is the basis for accreditation from an accreditation body. The current release was published in 2005. There are two main clauses in ISO/IEC 17025 - Management Requirements and Technical Requirements.

ISO/IEC 17025 was prepared by the ISO Committee on conformity assessment (CASCO). It was circulated for voting to the national bodies of both ISO and IEC, and was approved by both organizations. This second edition cancels and replaces the first edition (ISO/IEC 17025:1999), which has been technically revised.

INTERNATIONAL ISO/IEC STANDARD 17025

Originally known as ISO/IEC Guide 25, ISO/IEC 17025 was initially issued by the International Organization for Standardization in 1999. There are many commonalities with the ISO 9000 standard, but ISO/IEC 17025 is more specific in requirements for competence and applies directly to those organizations that produce testing and calibration results and is based on somewhat more technical principles. Transitioning from the 2005 Version of ISO/IEC 17025 In the world of international ISO standards, ISO/IEC 17025:2017 was welcomed as the new standard for the general requirements for the competence of testing and calibration laboratories. It was 12 years since the prior version was published.

Transitioning from ISO 17025:2005 to ISO/IEC 17025:2017

As a consequence, a revised deadline of 1 st June 2021 has been agreed, and accreditation against ISO/IEC 17025: 2005 shall be recognised up until this date. UKAS has been working with its accredited laboratories over the past 3 years to ensure that all were successfully transitioned before the deadline.

Of course, ISO/IEC 17025:2005 is officially owned by ISO CASCO (Committee on Conformity Assessment Standards), so any new revision would have to come from them. ISO CASCO members have 90 days to vote/respond to a June 15 ballot initiative to revise the standard.
